HELPFUL TIPS

UK and Ireland are wonderful places to visit all year round. Before you begin your trip, make sure to read our helpful travel information, to make the most of your time in London, Dublin and beyond.

WHEN TO GO

The weather in the UK and Ireland varies throughout the year. Summer (June – August) is the warmest season, with long sunny days and cooler evenings. In autumn (September – November), temperatures dip as the countryside becomes ablaze with colour.

Winter (December – February) brings short days, cold conditions and sometimes snow, perfect for strolling magical Christmas markets with mulled wine. In spring (March – May), it can still be quite wet, although the temperatures start to warm, and spring flowers bloom.

UK: Pound Sterling (GBP).
Ireland: Euro (EUR).



Language

UK: English, Welsh and Gaelic.
Ireland: English and Gaelic.



Time Zone

10 hours behind Australian Eastern Standard Time (AEST). Daylight savings is observed from March to October.



Electricity

An international adaptor is required. Type G, high voltage 230V/50Hz.



PLAN AHEAD

- Pre-booking entrances and tours are essential to avoid disappointment, long queues and limited availability, especially during peak travel seasons.
- When packing, keep in mind that lifting luggage onto trains or up stairs may be required, as many older hotels don't have elevators.

ITINERARY TIPS

- Expect four seasons in a day, so make sure you pack waterproof jackets and layers, even in summer.
- When crossing the border between the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland you are crossing between two different countries. There are no passport controls, and you can freely travel by car or train. But be mindful that Northern Ireland use the Pound and the Republic of Ireland use the Euro.

VISAS & PASSPORTS

All travellers to the UK and Ireland must carry a passport valid for at least six months beyond the date of departure from Australia. All travellers to the UK are required to obtain an Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA) prior to travel. As visa information can change at any time, we recommend you seek advice regarding passports, visas, and other travel requirements at smarttraveller.gov.au

MANDATORY TAX

Manchester and Liverpool charge a local tax. These taxes are not included in the listed "From" price as they are payable direct to your hotel on checkout. The Manchester City Visitor Charge is £1 plus VAT per room per night and the Liverpool Accommodation Business Improvement District charge is £2 plus VAT per room per night.

DRIVING TIPS

- Bus lanes are strictly monitored by cameras in cities, and fines are heavy for driving in them.
- Allow extra time as UK journeys can be slower than at home due to traffic and winding country lanes.
- In rural areas, beware of blind turns and poorly lit roads. Due to the narrowness of roads, be prepared to use passing places and take turns with oncoming traffic.
- Some suburbs within central London are part of a congestion charge zone. Driving within this area between certain times will result in a minimum charge of £18 per day.

RING OF KERRY

SLEA HEAD DRIVE

DINGLE PENINSULA

CONNEMARA

Glengesh Pass climbs through the mountains of Donegal between Ardara and Glencolmcille, following narrow roads, steep valley sides and wide views across open countryside.

COUNTY WATERFORD

The Copper Coast offers winding shoreline roads between Tramore and Dungarvan, passing small fishing villages, historic mining sites and striking views across the Atlantic Ocean.

CAUSEWAY COASTAL ROUTE

NORTHERN IRELAND

The Causeway Coastal Route from Belfast to Derry leads you to the Giant's Causeway, where ancient volcanic rock formations blend with sweeping sea views.

DRIVING TIPS

- Signposts in the Republic of Ireland display information in both English and Gaelic, however, in Gaeltacht (Irish speaking) areas they are written only in Gaelic.
- The Republic of Ireland uses the metric system and Northern Ireland uses the imperial system. Be careful when reading road signs with distances and speed limits as it will differ depending on where you are.
- Australian and New Zealand Disability Parking Permits can be used to for accessibility parking spots.
- Watch out for fuel prices when filling up as Northern Ireland uses Pounds and the Republic of Ireland uses Euros.
